## **Bulldogs Drop First Three Games**

The UNCA men's basketball team opened the 1991-92 season with a 65-60 home loss to Union College on Nov. 23. The Bulldogs followed that game with two consecutive road losses to Western Carolina University and Syracuse University to bring their record to 0-3. 


