The purpose of these grants is to increase mutual understanding between the peoples of the United States and other countries through the exchange of persons, knowledge, and skills. They are provided under the terms of the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961 Fulbright-Hays Act) and by oreign governments, universities, and private donors. Most of the grants provide ound-trip transportation, uition, and maintenance for one academic year. Applicants must be U.S. citizens at the time of application and generally must hold a bachelor's degree or its equivalent before the beginning date of the grant and, in most ases, should be proficient in he language of the host country.
