***1994 Predoctoral Fellowships in Biological Sciences.** Sixty-six fellowships will be awarded by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute for full time study toward a Ph.D. or Sc.D. degree in the biological sciences. Awards are for three years, with extension possible for two additional years of full support. The fellowships are intended for students who have completed less than one year of graduate study toward M.S., Ph.D., or Sc.D. degrees in biological sciences. Students who hold or are pursuing medical or dental degrees may also be eligible to apply for fellowship support for study toward the Ph.D. or Sc.D. Deadline to apply is Nov. 5, 1993. ***The U.S. Department of Energy,** recognizing the increasing loss of the U.S. in manufacturing of products will offer a program of Predoctoral Fellowships in Integrated Manufacturing. The objective of the program is threefold: To create a pool of Ph.D.s trained in the integrated approach to manufacturing, to promote academic interest in the field, and to attract talented professionals to this challenging area of engineering. It is anticipated that the program will result in the creation of new manufacturing methods that will contribute to improved energy efficiency, to better utilization of scarce resources, and to less degradation of the environment. Recent studies have concluded that there is a need for more integrated approach to manufacturing than that prevailing in U.S. industrial practice. The Integrated Manufacturing Predoctoral Fellowship Program is open only to individuals who, at the time of application, are U.S. citizens or nationals or permanent resident aliens of the U.S. Eligible applicants must have received a master's degree before the beginning of the fall 1994 term.
