The volleyball team lost their match against the Winthrop University Eagles on Oct. 7 with a score of 3-1.

They won their match against the High Point University Panthers on Oct. 8 with a score of 1-3.

In game one against the Eagles, Rose Butler, senior middle-blocker, made 10 kills and Elif Unlu, junior outside hitter, recorded 15.

In their game against the Panthers the Bulldogs made 11 team blocks.

"One of our goals going into Winthrop was to take a game off of them," said Julie Torbett, volleyball head coach. "That was a definite goal and we almost took two games off of them so we almost pushed it to five which would have been really nice."

The Bulldogs won the first game against the Eagles with a score of 28-30 but the Eagles won the next three.

"Even though we lost and we did not play our best I think that one of the highlights was that we saw that there is an ability to beat them," said Megan Murphy, senior defensive specialist. "The most encouraging part is that the team now knows that Winthrop is beatable and we can place third in conference."

The Eagles took game two 30-17, game three 30-28 and game four 30-19.

"Losing to the No. 1 team in the conference and three-time defending champions did not have a negative affect on the team's morale, we were the only team that has taken a game off of them at this point in conference," Torbett said. "We did that without one of our starters. We hate to lose, but in a lot of respects we look at it like we can beat them and that is really important for the team to have that mental confidence that any given night we can beat Winthrop because they are a very strong team."
