TRUMP IMPLIES PENCE'S TREATMENT OF LGBTQ+ Community Will Leave Bloodtrail

Since the beginning of Trump's presidency, various groups of people have called for his impeachment. Although a Trump impeachment would in fact be preferred by many, it would then default the country into the hands of Mike Pence, the former Indiana governor and current vice president.

During a meeting with Pence and a legal scholar about topics such as abortion and gay rights, Trump gestured toward Pence saying, "Don't ask that guy — he wants to hang them all," in reference to the LGBTQ+ community.

It is one thing to engage in discussion, even argue, with views not partial to one's own; it is another thing for Trump to make a joke on the behalf of the safety and welfare of the millions of LGBTQ+ citizens in this country.

Aside from being an entirely evil and vulgar comment, it emphasizes the very real dangers the LGBTQ+ community face on a daily basis, dangers and fear that have only been enhanced since the beginning of Trump's term.
