The campus has been improved wonderfully and with this and the new buildings, Rutherford College is becoming equal in beauty to its surroundings. That is saying quite a good deal, for old Grandfather Mountain on the North and Table Rock on the west and all the intervening peaks between furnish you a scene too peautiful to describe. Old Grand-father and Table Rock have stood sentinel over Rutherford for these nearly fourscore years. They have played well their part in lifting the horizon of many young men who from the Rutherford College campus builded in their imagination their future as it spread out before them. No wonder ministers have come from these surroundings. No one could stay there without being inspired.

I want to insist that you begin now to make arrangements to send your boy to Rutherford College next fall. This is the institution in which you can, even with small means, equip him to meet the issues of life on almost equal footing with any boy. There are many advantages in sending him there.
