Stevenson, Jr. This an-nouncement is made after action was taken by the faculty to change the holiday because of special request made by the Student Government association.

The association met in chapel and requested a student body vote on the matter of having the date switched. A majority vote of nearly two thirds confirmed the request made by students. Then the resolution was taken to the Dean of the school, who in turn brought up the matter for faculty consideration.
