John Eversman Is Named Head Of Public Relations Department

President Stamey Is Pleased With Addition To Staff. Duties Are Cited

John D. Eversman, recreational director of the Ecusta Paper corporation, has been named head of the department of public relations at Brevard college, President Robert H. Stamey announces.

Mr. Eversman will assume his duties at the local educational institution on January 1, and he will also continue to direct the Ecusta band, which at that time will be given to the Brevard high school.

President Stamey said Brevard college was indeed fortunate in having a man with such wide experience to be in charge of public relations. Mr. Eversman will be in charge of publicity and will head the student recruitment program.
