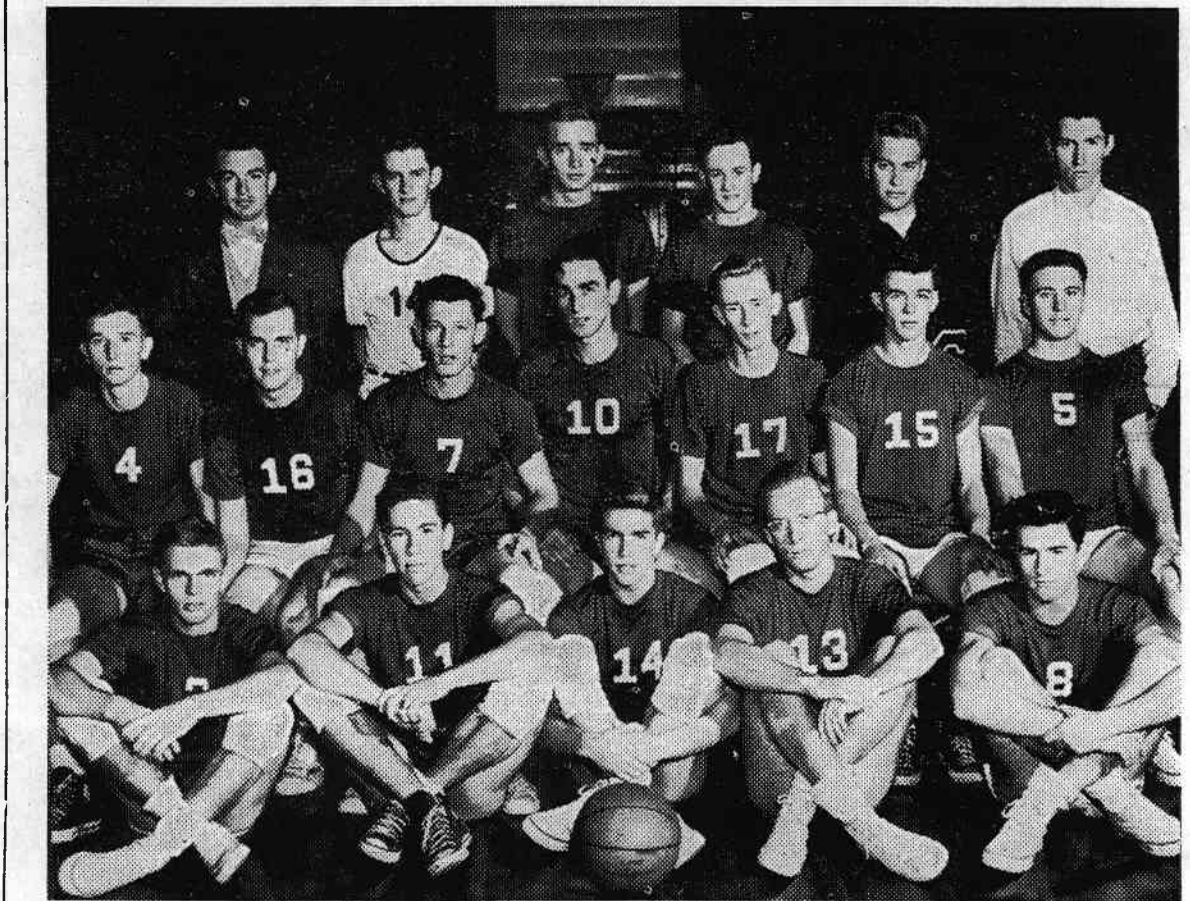

### Brevard Tops Mars Hill In 81-80 Score

Last Saturday night the Brevard college Tornadoes pulled a game out of the fire with a finish that would have made Frank Merriwell turn green with envy. After being behind eleven points at the half and 17 points at one stage of the third quarter, the blue and white came back with a roar that sent campus morale up approximately 200 per cent and won 81-80.

Brevard's high scorer was Jim Stamey, with 24 points. Malcolm followed closely with 19, Hoyle had 16, Eller made 10, and Walton scored 9. The exceptionally good rebounding, plus the smooth ball handling and the general sharpness of the Tornadoes told the tale. Not once, prior to this game, had the Tornadoes looked so sharp.

In the first few moments of play, Mars Hill had built up a 6-1 lead, and for the remainder of the first quarter, it looked as if the home
