have chosen Miss Annie Lou Allison to represent them, but we know her as "Al" and it will be just "Al" who is our representative.

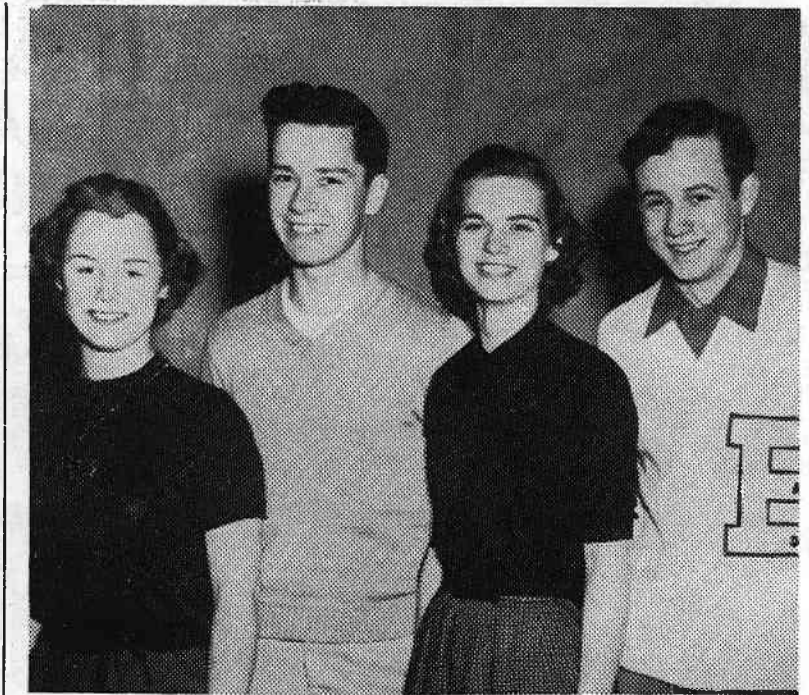

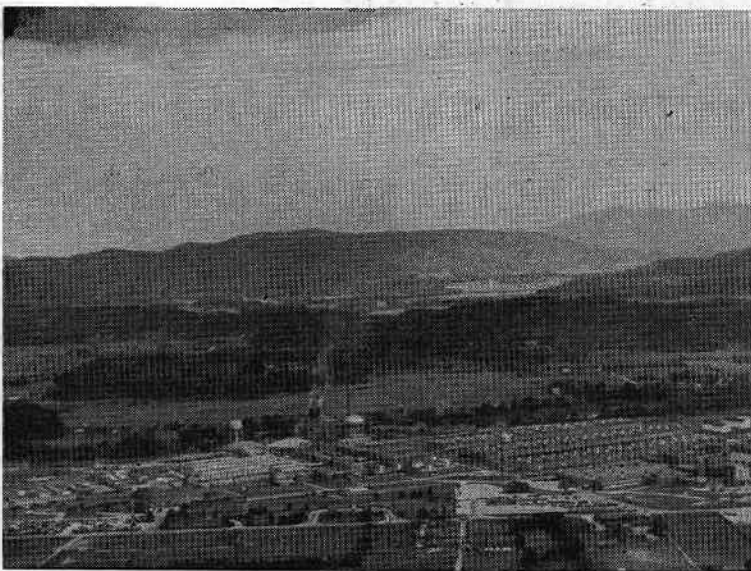
