

New Methodist Minister Here Gets Official Welcome On Tuesday Night

Rev. Douglas Corriher, the new minister of the First Methodist church here, was officially welcomed to Brevard at the monthly meeting of the Men's Fellowship club Tuesday evening in the church dining room.

President Ralph Heller presided over the dinner meeting and he presented Mr. Corriber to the large group of men attending. The new pastor succeeds Rev. J. Julian Holmes, who was transferred to Newton after a successful fouryear pastorate here.

Mr. Corriher comes to Brevard from Asheville, where he was pastor of the Haywood Street church for the past four years. Prior to that time he was at the Spencer Memorial church in Charlotte for four years and at Matthews and Waxhaw.

A native of Columbia, S. C., the Rev. Mr. Corriber moved to Charlotte with his family when quite young. He graduated from Central high school there and in 1937 received his A. B. degree at Duke university. From Duke he went to Yale Divinity school for seminary training, where he served as director of youth work and the pastor's assistant in the First Congregational church. This required an extra year in seminary and in 1941 he received his B. D. degree.


