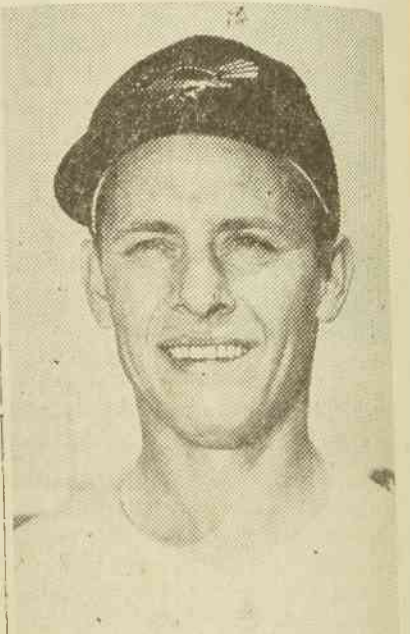
## Alpha Beta Gamma

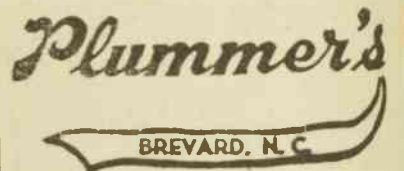
