Mr. and Mrs. Middleton sent their son, Charles, all the way from Stokesdale to Brevard. Charlie is a business administration major and will seek a position in that field.

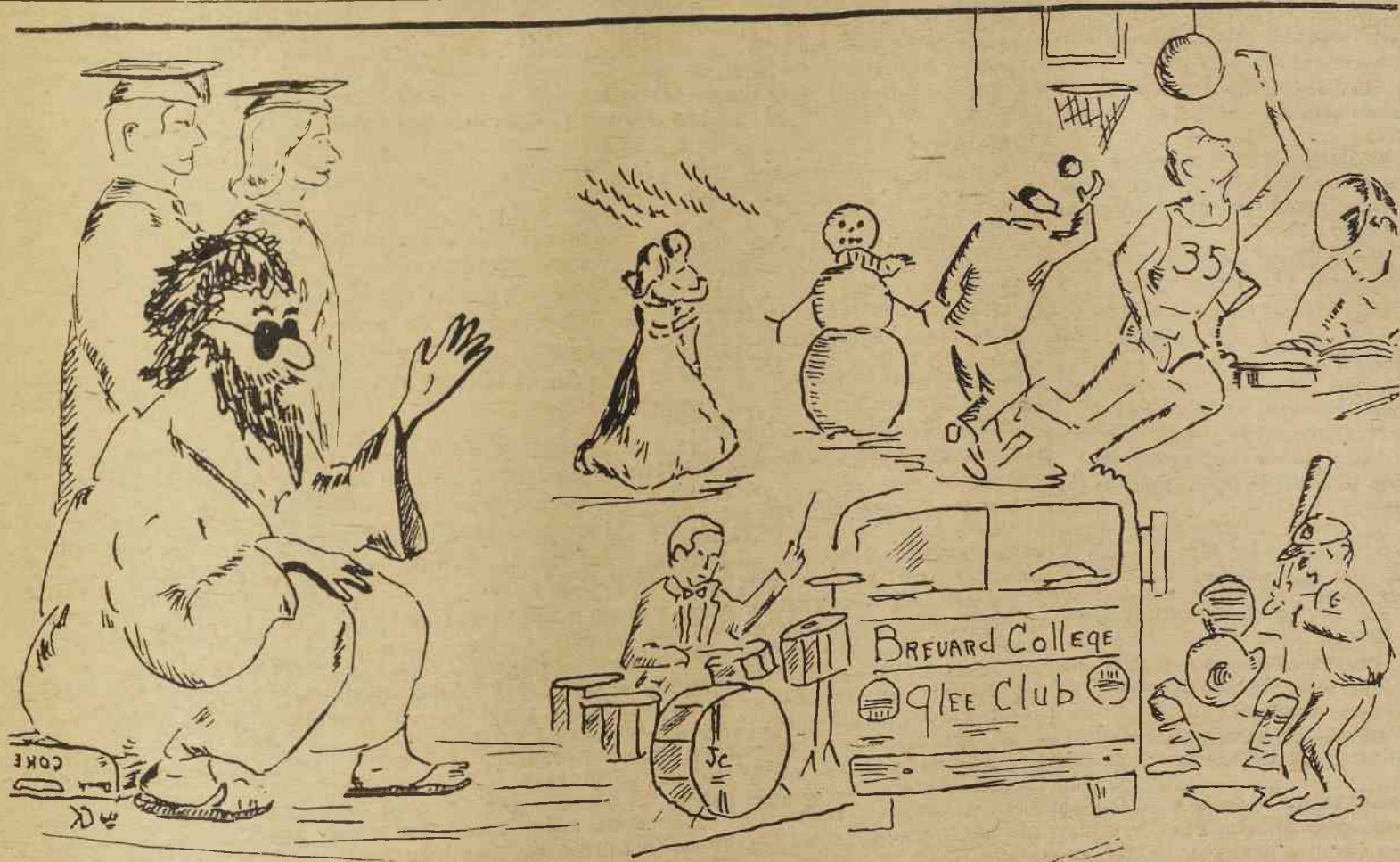
