## TORNADO TALK

The Western Carolinas' Junior College Conference, of which Brevard College is a member, looks like it will be very well balanced this year, with several teams having a number of outstanding players returning, according to Coach "Chick" Martin. In addition to Brevard, the W.C.J.C.C. is made of the following teams: Mars Hill, North Greenville, Lees McRae, Asheville Biltmore, Spartanburg, Gardner Webb, and Wingate.

Wingate won the championship last year with North Greenville as runner-up and Brevard finishing third. This year the same three teams have some of their better players returning along with Lees McRae and Gardner Webb. The Tornadoes will be ranked as one of the stronger teams of the conference, but will have to continue to make improvement in order to be a contender for the conference championship.

Wingate lost several of their outstanding players but have several excellent freshmen on their team which will still make them a strong contender again this year.

North Greenville, the second-place team, has an outstanding player returning in Randy Duncan along with several outstanding freshmen that were recruited during the summer.

Brevard was able to defeat Gardner Webb twice last year by slim margins of one point and five points. Gardner Webb lost only one man from their starting team and will be very tough again this year.

The Tornadoes split two games with Lees McRae during the regular season and won by one point over them in the consolation bracket of the tournament for third place. Lees McRae did not lose a single man from its team and therefore will have a very good team again this year.

Spartanburg, Asheville Biltmore, and Mars Hill did not have very outstanding records last year, but these teams can be depended upon to improve as the season progresses.

This should be an exciting year for the students; the balanced league this year in basketball should provide the student body with the opportunity to see some close and exciting ballgames. Coach Martin expressed the hope that the team's record will be good, particularly on the home court where the Tornadoes suffered only one loss last year.

He added that the team will have to improve over its present status in order to be able to hold its own in the conference. The team is rounding into shape rather slowly physically, having had several minor injuries.
