

commander of the army.

Lee was made a general in the Confederacy and was given the task of defending the eastern pertion of Virginia.

Robert E. Lee took the confederate army to the very brink of victory by his military genius. He didn't have a well equipped army; it has been described as being an "army fed with hunger, clothed in rags, with a genius to guide it.'

After several victories Lee decided that the time had come to carry the war to the North. In July of 1863, Lee led his Virginians into Pennsylvania. The heartbreak of Gettysburg is one of the more famous battles of history. After this defeat, the end of the war was only a matter of time.

After the war Lee spent the last five years of his life laboring to reunite his country and build up George Washington College at Lexington, Va. He died Oct. 12, 1870, while serving as President of the college which now is Washington and Lee University.
