

## Brevard Splits In Four Games

A quick glance at the basketball games played this past week found the Tornadoes splitting a four-game slate.

Earlier in the week, Brevard maintained their unblemished conference mark of 4-0 defeating Spartanburg by a 93-64 score. Wayne Huntley led in scoring with 20 points. Joe Forte netted 14 to back up Huntley's performance.

On Tuesday night, the Tornadoes were stunned in a 99-97 overtime defeat at the hands of North Greenville Mounties. This marked Brevard's first conference defeat. Eugene Allen showed his potential by leading the scoring with 25 points, followed by Huntley with 24 and Joe Forte with 20.

Seemingly still in the "rut," the Tornadoes were trounced by the Wingate Bulldogs in a 78-49

commander of the army.

Lee was made a general in the Confederacy and was given the task of defending the eastern portion of Virginia.

Robert E. Lee took the confederate army to the very brink of victory by his military genius. He didn't have a well equipped army; it has been described as being an "army fed with hunger, clothed in rags, with a genius to guide it."

After several victories Lee decided that the time had come to carry the war to the North. In July of 1863, Lee led his Virginians into Pennsylvania. The heartbreak of Gettysburg is one of the more famous battles of history. After this defeat, the end of the war was only a matter of time.

After the war Lee spent the last five years of his life laboring to reunite his country and build up George Washington College at Lexington, Va. He died Oct. 12, 1870, while serving as President of the college which now is Washington and Lee University.

It seems like records of old are being broken by athletes throughout the country nowadays. Brevard now sports a record-breaker in basketball. Forward Eugene Allen has broken the consecutive free throw record of 17 set by Gerald Baker in 1958. Allen had pumped in 26 consecutive free throws before missing one in Monday night's game with Asheville - Biltmore. He has a 28 - 30 free throw record in total, which gives him a 93% average on free throws.
