The Student Government Asociation Council has suggested the following revisions of the constitution for next year: (1) GGA fees, which were formerly $\$ 1$ per semester, should be raised beginning, September, 1963 to $\$ 1.50$ per semester to enable the Council to support the Homecoming Dance, provide bet ter campus movies, and sponsor activities similar to the trip to the Biltmore House and Gardens. (2) Officers of any organiza ion on campus, serving in any capacity including hall proctors should be permitted to retain their position until the end of the first semester in case of any fficer's failure to maintain a "C" average at the first grading period of eight weeks. After the perst semester, he will be required to maintain a "C" average every grading period with no D's or F's.
