Last year's champions, Hendersonville High, will not participate in this year's meet. Coach Rob Brown late last year committed the Bearcats to Southern meet in Knoxville beore knowing that the date con licted with the relays here. Coach Martin, athletic direc or of Brevard College, is serv ng as director of the Western Carolina meet and is accepting entries from schools. Entries alo are being handled by the Brevard Jaycees. Invitations mailed y the Asheville Jaycees went o almost 90 schools from throughout Western North Caro-

The meet itself will be governed by state high school regulations. Only three individuals from each school and only one elay team per school may en er an event. Points will be warded for five places both in elays and individual events. The relay scoring is $10,8,6,4$, , and individual 5 through 1.
Medals are to be awarded for each first place and ribbons will be given for the ather places. Trophies will be given or the first five places in team tandings and an additional rophy will go the the most utstanding performer
