Baseball Team Splits

On April 15, the Brevard baseball team lost a conference game to Wingate 8-4, here at Brevard.

The Tornadoes used three pitchers in this game. Starting pitcher Gerald Enter was relieved after the first inning when he allowed 4 hits and 4 runs. Relief pitcher, Joe McCall, went for 4 2/3 innings before being relieved by Danny Denton. McCall allowed 5 hits and 4 runs. Denton relieved McCall in the last of the fifth inning and pitched the remainder of the game, allowing only 1 hit and no runs.

Charlie Stroudenmire was Brevard's best batter, hitting 2 for 4.

In the third inning, Danny Denton singled driving in Joe McCall. In the fourth inning, Tornado first baseman Phil Claytor singled, and was driven to third on a double hit by Stoudenmire. McCall singled driving in both players.

Brevard's last score came in the 7th when Johnny Gossett

led off with a single, and moved to third when Ron Morgan singled. Gossett scored when the Wingate short stop made an error.

On Wednesday, April 12 the team traveled to Anderson for an inter-conference game which they won 4-3.

Gerald Enter went all the way for the Tornadoes in a great pitching exhibition. Winning his first game of the season Enter allowed only 9 hits. He walked four and struck out five, as he and the tough Brevard defense held Anderson to only three runs.

Brevard co-captain, Johnny Gossett got things rolling for the Tornadoes in the seventh inning when he doubled, driving in Phil Claytor. Gossett then scored on Enter's single.

In the ninth inning Enter scored when pinch hitter Bill Farnum tripled. Farnum then scored the winning run when co-captain Johnny Warlick singled.

Brevard Wins Tri-Meet

The Brevard College Track Team, under the direction of Coach Thad Talley, completely dominated action in a tri-meet with Gardner - Webb and Wingate College to win the meet with a total of 109 points. Gardner - Webb placed second with 53 points, followed by Wingate with 19 points.

Two of "Talley's Terrors" set new school records in the tri-meet. John Sim set a new record in the broad jump with a fabulous leap of 21' 8" breaking the old record of 21' 6 1/2" set in 1962 by Eddie Wallace. Roger Jones set a new record in the 440 yard intermediate hurdles with a tremendous time of 58.1 seconds. Roger broke his own record set earlier in the year of 58.6 seconds.
