Coach Martin is one of nine members on the committee headed by Dr. Barrow, head of the Physical Education Department at Wake Forest. The group met at Coleman Gymnasium at the University of North Carolina, in Greensboro, September 19 and 26.

The committee's functions involves the transfer of physical education and health to the senior college level. It attempts to bring the two within a level of acceptance by all senior colleges for transfer credit.

A recommendation made at the committee meeting stated that physical education and health continue to be required of freshman and sophomore college students. The committee concerns itself with both junior and senior colleges throughout the state.
