Thad Talley, former Furman standout under Coach Chuck Rohe, is coming to U-T as Rohe's track assistant.

Talley is moving from Brevard Junior College. He will be a part · time coach, working in the mornings as a physical education teacher at Webb School and in the afternoons and weekdays

with the Volunteers.
Thad, from Canton, Miss., started in college sports as a football end at Ole Miss. He switched to Hinds Junior College and later to Furman when his size forced him into track.

Talley climbed in the 880 until he was sixth - ranked in the world. He cleared 13-6 in the pole vault with a metal pole and became a consistent winner in the high jump, triple jump and 440.

Coach Talley, in a personal letter to each member of the track and cross country teams, stated:




