Mr. Murray Lectures At AB

Mr. Tim Murray, head of the art department of Brevard College, was guest speaker Asheville - Biltmore College Wednesday. His lecture on the Pollock, Albers, and Rauschenburg is part of a series known as "Learn and Share", sponsored by the Asheville Jr. League.

This art education program is designed to educate interested adults so that they, in turn, may go to city and county schools to educate children in the enjoyment of art.

In addition to the program Wednesday, there will be other programs slated for the remainder of October by other experts in art, such as Mr. Gene Bunker, head of the Asheville - Biltmore art department; Mr. Chris Robertson, head of the Mars Hill College department; and Mr. Jos Vandermeer, former instructor at the Asheville Art Museum and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

These men will present 20th century artists to the volunteers who will be working with children on the fifth grade level.

Mr. John Bridges, a member of the Asheville Art Museum Board and Mr. Joe Hall, an Asheville architect, will instruct the volunteers interested in art history on the sixth grade level.


