

A second place rating was awarded the CLARION, newspaper recently by the Associated Collegiate Press at the University of Minnesota in the 81st All American Critical Service. Approximately 600 newspapers from throughout the United States were evaluated.

Newspapers published from January through May were judged on coverage and content, writing and editing, editorial leadership, physical appearance and least four such credits to be rated All American.

Ratings of First Class (excellent); Second Class (very good), and Third Class (good) are given on the basis of total numerical scores achieved in the five classifications. The Clarion totaled 3235 points.

"Competition for top ratings is tougher each year," Otto W. Quale, ACP executive director stated. "College editors, writers and photographers of today grew up in a whole new world of mass communications and their newspapers reflect this sophistication. There is more in-depth reporting and significant editorial content than was apparent five years ago.
