This year Bob plans to throw both the discus and the shot. His personal goal over the next two years is to throw the discus up to 150 feet and win an ath-

Sugarbear is looking forward to competing against some of the bigger schools and feels he performs best under strong competition.

Sugarbear feels the coach is an instrumental member of any track team. He feels the coach "must take an interest in an athlete's needs and take the time to encourage and help him." Bob feels there is a great deal of pressure on athletes in track and field. In many cases he feels they are asked to produce too quickly, and this often hurts their performance.

The Brevard Tornados traveled to Spartanburg this past Saturday night for a WCJCC basketball game, only to come home over the mountains with a disappointing 87-59 loss.

Head coach, "Chick" Martin, and assistant, Larry Burch, just could not get the team together, and at halftime, Spartanburg held a commanding 44-20 lead.

Forward Bob Wolf led the

scoring for the Tornados with a total of 17 points and 6 rebounds. Next on the scoring list was Ed Humphrey, who tallied a total of 11 points for the evening and 6 rebounds followed by Roger Jamison with 11 points. Also contributing were Tom Keithley with 8, and Bill McLain with 6 points.

Brevard's roundballers faced Montreat Anderson February 3, and will play at home again

against North Greenville tomorrow night, in a game which should be a thriller.

Despite going through a very disappointing season, with a record of 7-0 in the Conference, and 5-15 overall, the Tornados still need our support as they prep for the all important conference tournament in Lenoir later this month. So let's let them know we haven't given up!

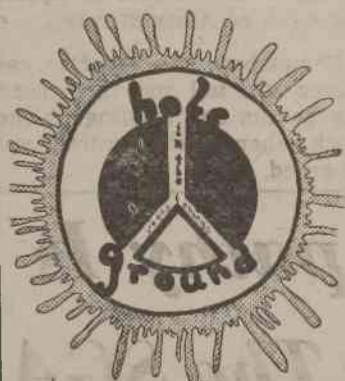
The second half told the story as Green's speed and depth pulled them through to a 17 point victory despite several Beam surges.
