Tennis Team Plays In Conference Tournament

The conference tennis tournament was held last Friday at Wingate College; and, as expected, the host team won all the honors. Regular season conference champion Wingate was followed by Anderson, Lees McRae, Brevard and Montreat-Anderson.

Brevard College was represented at the tournament by sophomores, Phil Hess, Ernie Sewell, and Mike Faggart. For various reasons Bob Propst, Stuart Byers and Lyndon Ashworth were not able to attend. Hess, Sewell, and Faggart all played singles while Hess and Sewell also joined to form a

doubles team. In the singles competition Hess and Sewell both lost to Anderson and Montreat - Anderson respectively. Faggart was the Tornadoes' sole victor in the singles as he beat Chuck Allen of Lees McRae 6-3, 4-6, 8-6. Faggart then advanced on to the semifinals where he lost 1-6, 1-6 to South African Tony Destanak of Wingate College.

Brevard's doubles team of Hess and Sewell also reached the semifinals as they beat Montreat - Anderson in three sets. In the semifinals the Tornadoes fell in two sets to Wingate.

Beam Dorm Wins The World Series

Beam outlasted Green I and III for the intramural softball championship as they won the best-out-of-three series, 2 to 1. Led by Don Duvall and a host of other talented batsmen, Beam bombed Green 11 to 2 in the first game. Green I and III bounced back in the second game to win 3 to 2 as the event went into an exciting extra inning. Mike Faggart knocked in

the run which proved to be the winning margin. The teams played twice that day because they were pressed for playing time. Beam opened up the first inning with five big runs as Don Duvall's bat once again led the way. Green tallied four runs in the bottom of the first inning. Beam came across with five more runs in the later innings, but Green failed to score. The game ended as Green hit into a double play which only proved typical play for the Beam champions as they won, 10 to 4.

Track Team Wins Region X Meet; McAfee, Stewart Invited To Phila.

The Brevard track team displayed their excellence once again in the Region Ten meet held here last Saturday. On their way to yet another victory, the team set 12 meet records, and broke two school records. Meet records were set in the 440 relay, Mile run, 120 HH, 440 dash, long jump, 440 IH, 220 dash, Javelin, pole vault, 2 mile relay and the triple jump. Ed Williams captured two school records by running the 100 yd. dash in 9.7 and by scoring more total points in a season than anyone in the history of Brevard track.

The National meet will be held in Mesa, Arizona, on May 20, 21, and 22. Brevard will be well represented by Lennox Stewart, Ed Williams, Reggie McAfee, and Clarence Thomas.

Two of the team's stars, McAfee and Stewart, have also been invited to compete in the International Freedom Games to be held Sunday, May 16, in Philadelphia, Pa. This nationally televised event will feature McAfee running against World Record holder Jim Ryan (3:51.1), NCHA champion Marty Liquori (3:58.5) and Oregon's Steve Savage (3:59.2), in the "Mile of the Century." A world record is predicted in this event; and if McAfee is able to break the 4 minute mile as expected, he will be-

ever to do so. Stewart will compete against the world's 6th best 880 man, Mark Wingan.

Brevard Linksters Head For Regionals

The Brevard Linksters, in conference play at Etowah last week, finished second behind Spartanburg Junior College. For the 36 hole match the total for Brevard was 619, as opposed to Spartanburg's team total of 603.

Low man for Brevard was Don Dickey, who shot a 76 and a 75 for a 151, for the two day event. Other Brevard team member scores for the match,

Placing second in conference play enables Brevard to participate in the Region 10 playoffs which will be held May 18 at Quail Ridge Country Club in Sanford, North Carolina. The winner of the playoffs will go to Flint, Michigan, for the nationals.
