The offices to be filled are the following: President of the Student Union, President of the Social Board, Speaker of the more class officers, Sophomore class representatives, Day Student President and dorm and day student representatives to the Social Board.

However, certain qualifications must be met in order to be elected to these posts. With the exception of the Sophomore judicial board members, and the dorm and day representatives, all candidates must have and maintain a 2.0 average through their term of office. The exceptions to this rule are required to maintain a 1.75 av-

All candidates for any office must be free of Disciplinary poation at the time of their election and throughout their term of office.
