Track team whips Brevard gains tri-meet win

Brevard College Lees - McRae and Milligan College in a three - way track meet

High individual winner for the Tornadoes was Sam Beasley with 24½ points. Beasley captured wins in the high jump, long jump, 100-yard dash, 220yard dash, a second in the triple jump, and was a member of the winning 440-relay team.

Don Goodspeed set a school record for Brevard with a time of 55.5 in the 440-hurdles.

Stoffel takes first

Brevard managed only to place three individuals in the Florida Relays. The only place finisher in the meet was Lee Stoffel who won the meet with a throw of 153 feet 1 inch in the discus. Clay White finished fifth in the triple jump with a jump of 45 feet, 6½ inches. Another fine performance was turned in by Sam Beasley, who placed seventh in the long jump with a jump of 22 feet 1134 inches.
