Brevard College becomes Dogpatch, U.S.A. in "L'il Abner"

On April 13, 14, and 15, the Brevard College campus will become Dogpatch, U.S.A., the setting for the foot-patting, ear-tingling, eye-grabbing musical comedy, L'IL ABNER. The show is presented by the Brevard College Fine Arts Division and is directed by Sam Cope, who also directed CAMELOT last year. Claire Cope has created a colorful array of Dogpatch costumes for the cast of 60. The orchestra, consisting of many music majors and several students, will be directed by Irene Brychein. Tom Cox of Brevard designed the lighting, and Brian McGuire has directed and set the lighting.

Eddie Gash will be seen in the title role of Abner Yokum. Jane Hodge, whom many will remember for her fine performance of Guenevere in last year's CAMELOT, will portray Daisy Mae. Daisy Mae has been chasing Little Abner in the Sadie Hawkins Day Race for years and hasn't caught him yet. But she never gives up hope and keeps trying even though she's getting "past her prime." Harvey Miller of the Brevard College music faculty will portray Marryin' Sam. Mr. Miller played the role of King Arthur in CAMELOT and does an equally fine job with Marryin' Sam. Brian McGuire will portray Earthquake McGoon, who is the world's dirtiest wrestler and who secretly desires to tangle with Daisy Mae. Other delightful and loveable Dogpatch characters in the show are Mammy and Pappy Yokum, (Kathy Gelbach and Keith McGinnis); the Scragg brothers, (John Williams, Dennis Brown, and Jay Roskam); and Moonbeam McSwine, (Mozette Riggsbee.) These people are supported by characters seen as Senator Jack S. Phogbound,

Available and Stupefying Jones, Hairless Joe and Lonesome Polecat, and the town's mayor, the Honorable Dan'l D. Wawgmeat. Hal Easter will be seen in the role of General Bullmoose, a "typical" Washington D. C. billionaire whose life-long dream has been to "get my hands on all the money in the world before that greatest Stockbroker of them all calls me to that Great Stock Market in the sky." The cast is also supported by many of the faculty children.

One of the very colorful features of the show will be an almost life-size paper mache statue of Julilation T. Cornpone, the town's most famous citizen. The statue has been created by Susan Huggins.

Curtain time will be 8:00 p. m. Admission is \$1.50 for adults and \$.75 for children. Tickets may be reserved by calling the Fine Arts Division of Brevard College. Reserved seats should be picked up at least 30 minutes before showtime.
