Kick-Off Dinner For Workers Held Monday Evening

A kick-off dinner meeting to launch the Brevard College 1972-73 Fund Drive was held Monday night, Feb. 12 in the A. G. Myers Cafeteria at the College.

While the meeting was primarily for Transylvania county workers, representatives from other areas attended. Ray Simmons, Vice President of Brevard's First Union National Bank, and Chairman of the Brevard College Development Council presided and stated that the year's Fund Drive would be expanded to include most of Western North Carolina. Dr. Robert A. Davis, President of Brevard College spoke briefly about the College's position in the community, its value in education, its contributions to the local economy, and the need for additional funds with which to help Brevard College meet its current needs.

Contributions will help to undergird and expand funds for student aid, the library, and help make other campus improvements.


