Brevard College President Dr. Robert A. Davis announced recently the appointment of Coach Norman Witek as Director of Athletics effective June 1. Witek, Coach of Brevard's Nationally prominent Track and Cross Country teams, succeeds Coach "Chick" Martin who leaves the post to continue in the real estate business in Bre-

"Chick Martin has built an outstanding athletic program at vard College loses his services. Under Coach Witek it is our intention to continue the high performance that has characterized our athletic program in recent years".

Coach Witek, a track performer at University of Tennessee, holds both the AB and MA Degree from the Knoxville institution. "Since his arrival at Brevard in 1968, his teams have achieved a notable record in both regional and national competition" stated Dr. Davis. "These same high standards will be continued in all areas in which Brevard College competes".
