Of the new classes being added to the curriculum, there will be two new English classes. One of these will deal with World Literature to 1500; the other, with Oral Communication. A course in the fundamentals of German grammar will also be offered. New Religion and Philosophy classes will be added, in the Social Studies area there will be a course of Selected Topics in the History of Russia as well as a new Psychology class. Also being added is an Acting Class that will explore different acting techniques. These new classes are designed to provide more options to students where required courses are concerned and to increase the number of electives. There probably will be new faculty in biology, math, English, and music, but the final decisions have not been made.

Besides new teachers and new classes, Brevard will have its annual share of freshman students. Among these new

students will be about fifteen international students. Anyone interested in requesting an international student as a roommate should speak with Dean Houk.

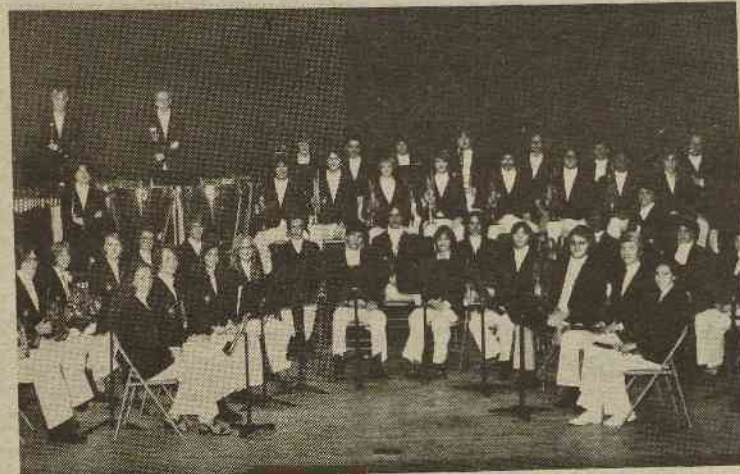

One can expect to see even more concern for the students by the student government next year since the new structure is built around the residence halls and the day student organization.

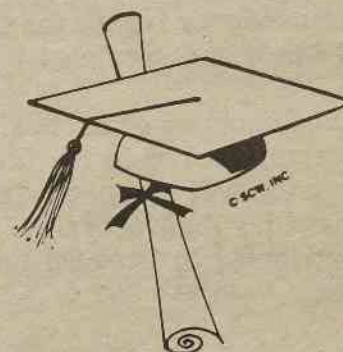
