


Brevard, however, has two athletes who are National Junior College champions. These are John Delaney in the 5000 meter run and Andy Latimer in the triple jump. Coach Witek went on to say that there are several other athletes who have a chance at being nationally ranked. These are Willie Holeman in long jump, Gordon Sneadon in the 5000 meter run, and Gerald Hutchinson in the 10,000 meter run.

The Brevard track team won their last meet which was against Carson-Newman College and Furman University. The scores were Brevard 67, Carson 64, and Furman 62.

The outlook for the Brevard track team next year is optimistic says coach Witek. Approximately 80% of the current track members will be returning next year. Says he, "If everyone gets the grades and continues to train during the summer, the goals will be unlimited."
