Dean of the College Dr. Harry Langley presented a paper on student retention at the 1987 International Conference on the First Year Experience this summer in Southampton, England.

Dr. Greer is also receiving his second doctorate degree later this month. This summer he completed his work for another Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration from Georgia State University.

Dean of Student Affairs Norm Witek and Athletic Director Don Scarborough have assumed their new duties after exchanging positions this summer.

Jock Lauterer, Director of Public Information and Instructor of Journalism, led a workshop on feature writing for the North Carolina Press Association Community Newspaper spring convention in Chapel Hill, and he attended several book signings for his new photo-documentary book, "Running on Rims — Appalachian Profiles," which has been featured recently in Country Living Magazine.
