

Retired General Colin Powell is a likely candidate for president in 1996. Powell is the first African-American to be chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff which he served under Presidents Bush and Clinton.

His political views are a mixture of conservative and liberal ideals. He has said that one option the country must consider is raising taxes to reduce the national debt. Powell also supports affirmative action. He is quoted as saying, "Anyone who would suggest that racism is a thing of the past is wrong; people are still being denied jobs because of the color of their skin."
