During the tense exam season, it is always good to escape the reality of studying for a while and nourish the starved mind with a great meal. For a great lunch after your exam, try Mother India. They feature an all-you-can-eat Indian food buffet for about six dollars that is loaded with vegetarian specialties like paneer, dahi and chana masala. They also have Tandoori Chicken and a beef meat entree, in addition to appetizers. Mother India is located on Hendersonville Rd (US 321) near Sound Familiar. Definitely worth the 20 minute drive. If you are in Asheville and would like an evening meal, check out Bistro. Located in the basement of the restaurant of the same name at 19 North Market Street, they feature a great Bar menu that is considerably less expensive than the main dining room. They also have live entertainment every evening, a fine selection of imported cigars, and many specialty cocktails. If you are looking for a "power lunch" to aid your exam, venture out to the Barefoot Cafe. Located directly across from the school on Caldwell, they feature vegetarian specials that change daily. And to top it off, try out Hawg Wild, the new barbecue joint across from Bi-Lo.

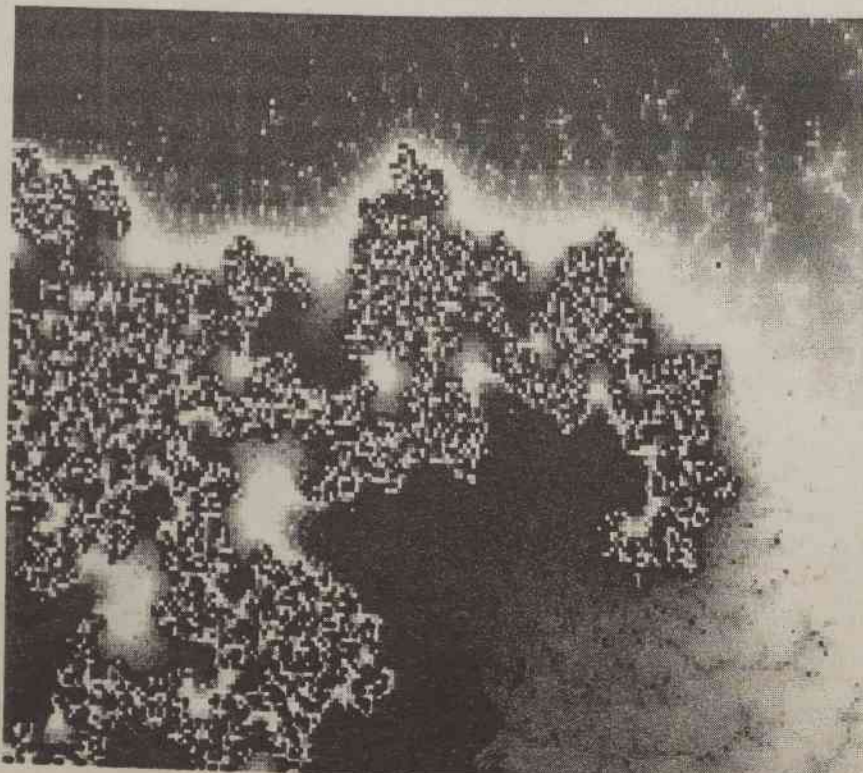
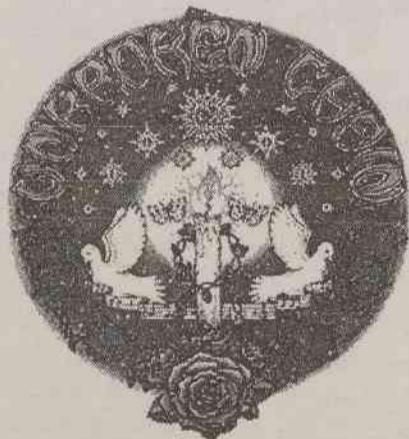
