Tuesday night was dress rehearsal for cast 1. Jenny Baxter and Dwight Chiles make the perfect Amalia and Georg. The chemistry isn't forced at all. One can only imagine what cast 2 has in store for the audience.

Witty undertones, enchanting songs, and mesmerizing talent are sewn throughout She Loves Me. She Loves Me makes for a wonderful date night or even a carefree friends' night out. Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$5 for children and students with ID.
