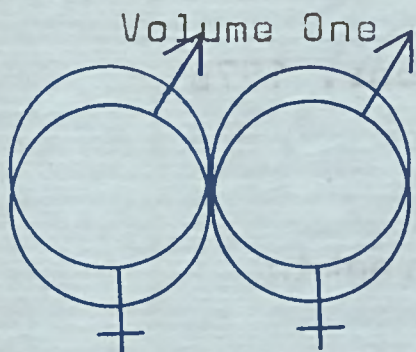

NEW COUNSELING RESOURCES FOR GAYS

Two new counseling services have opened in the Triangle Area for gays.

The CROSSPOINT COUNSELING SERVICE is a newly formed, small professional service which provides individual, group and couple or marital counseling in an atmosphere of acceptance, trust and flexibility. Maureen Malone and Mindy Wood (two CGA friends) will help you explore your feelings, behavior, problem solving and environment, using a clinical social work orientation which combines the best of counseling techniques. CROSSPOINT is located at 2715 Chapel Hill Road--a half block north of the bridge where Chapel Hill Road passes over Chapel Hill Boulevard. For an appointment, call 493-1159. Hours are flexible and fees moderate and reasonable.

For students at UNC, free counseling in the areas of personal, social, couple/relationship/vocational concerns is available now at the UNIVERSITY COUNSELING SERVICE (formerly Guidance and Testing Center), in Nash Hall, on Cameron Avenue.
