Leslie Feinberg:

Author of Stone Butch Blues and Trangender Warriors, Leslie Feinberg is a grassroots activist, journalist, and lecturer for lgbt folks. Stone Butch Blues won both the American Library Association's Award for gay and lesbian literature and the Lambda Literary Award. She came of age in the 1960s as a drag queen in the gay bars of New York and southern Ontario.

Transgender Warriors, hir (gender-neutral pronoun) personal account examines history "through a lens that acknowledges our common ancestry of outlaws: not through a single identity, rather through a common transgressive value system to which any of us might subscribe." Feinberg's goal is to build a bridge between the lgb community and transgendered persons, while at the same time, challenging the public to devise political systems that incorporate notions of inclusivity.
