MAY DAY PROGRAM

The Social Committee of Louisburg College has announced the following Homecoming and May Day program for this coming week-end.

At one-thirty o'clock on Saturday, May 4, on the college athletic field, there will be a baseball game between members of the class of '35 and a college team.

The May Day fete will be held at four-thirty o'clock on the northwest campus which is used as an amphitheatre.

At six-thirty o'clock class dinners will be held in the college dining hall. Senator D. B. Fearling, President of the Roanoke Island Historical Association, has been invited as speaker.

From nine to eleven o'clock in the evening the college will be hosts in the college parlors to students and visiting alumni.

On Sunday morning, May 5, at eleven o'clock there will be a special sermon at the Louisburg Methodist Church. Dr. Walter Patten, President of the College, will fill the pulpit at the request of the alumni.
