Miss Cour was appointed Junior Class sponsor. The officers of the Junior Class feel that they are very fortunate to have her as their sponsor.

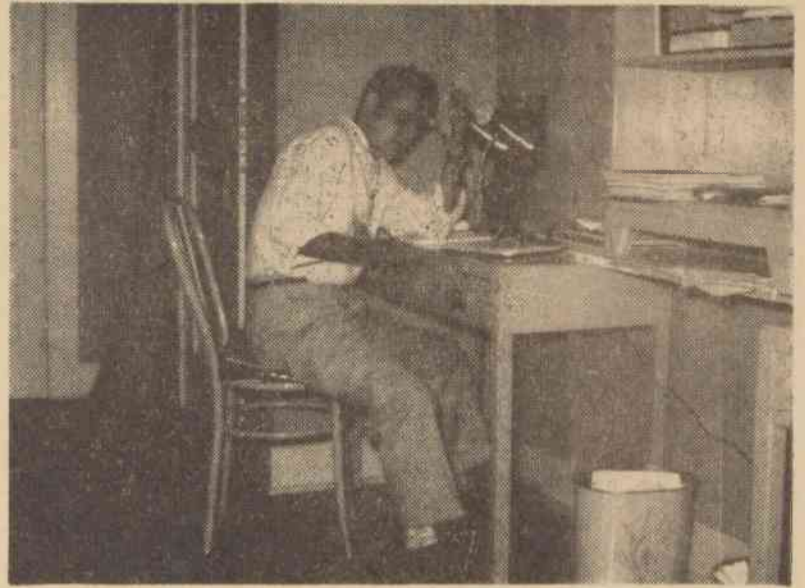

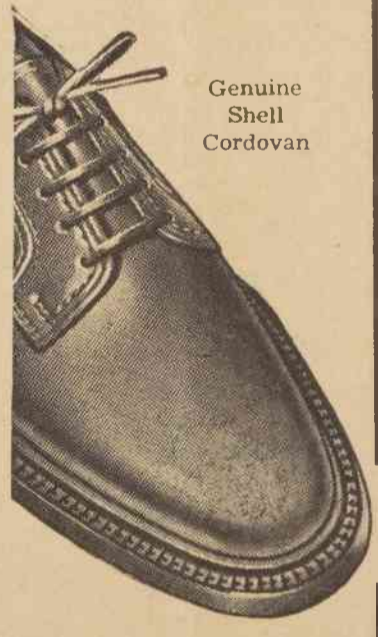
