Eleven girls have been chosen to participate in this year's Homecoming festivities from various clubs and organizations on campus. The following girls will compete for the 1968

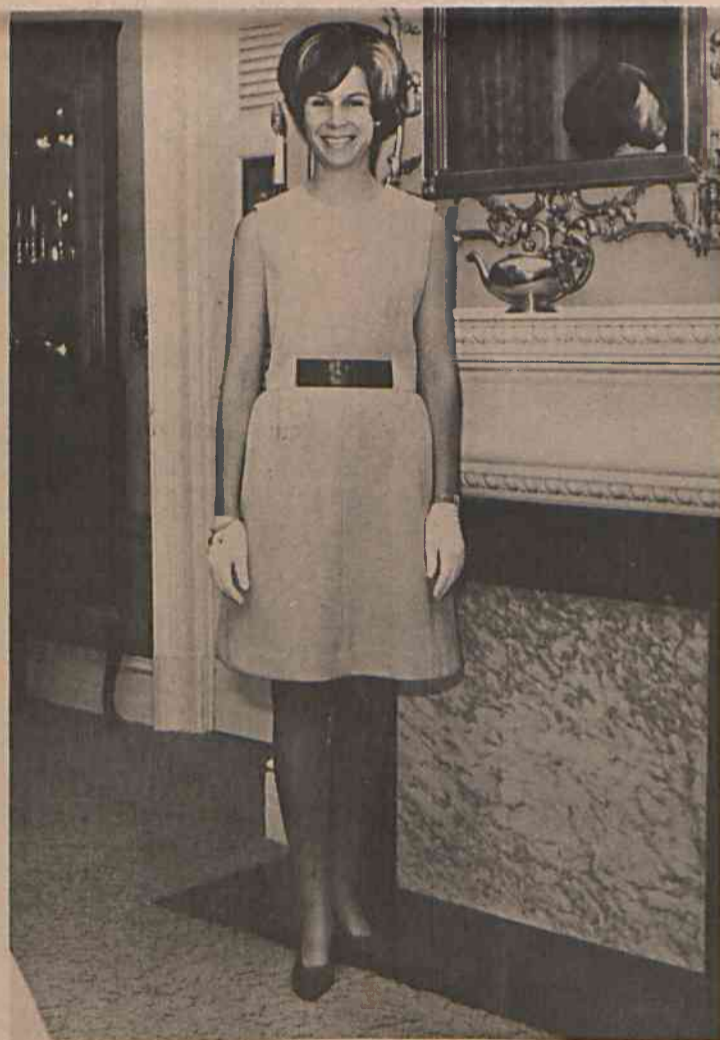
