ASSEMBLY TO PRESENT NEW YORK EXECUTIVE -- MARION ANNOUNCED AS WUS SPEAKER

World University Service executive secretary, Leon O. Marion of the New York Office, will be speaker at the 11:00 a.m. Louisburg assembly March 2. Having been associated with WUS for a number of years, formerly of the Atlanta office immediately before being transferred to the New York national headquarters, Mr. Marion has intimate and extensive knowledge of the administrative aspect of the organization. He has for a number of years helped direct WUS efforts on college campuses. Also, he has travelled to needy parts of the world, especially in Asia, where he has gained firsthand knowledge of what he has described as extremely adverse conditions of students' lives. Mr. Marion has visited places, too, where such conditions have been greatly relieved through WUS, as it has given the initial impetus and means for meeting various needs.

Secretary Marion has previously visited Louisburg campus in interest of WUS and has expressed high appreciation of what the college has done for the cause. In a recent letter he wrote, "As I reflect on my impending return to Louisburg, my feelings can best be described as joyful."
