Lou-U Ends Presidential Search With May

OFFICIAL PRESS RE-LEASE

In concluding a national search, the Board of Trustees of Louisburg College is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Ronald L. May as President of the College. Dr. May succeeds Dr. J. Allen Norris, Jr., who resigned last Spring after seventeen years as President in order to accept a position with the North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. Dr. C. Edward Brown, Jr. has been serving as acting President.

Dr. May was chosen by the Board with the

unanimous recommendation of a nineteen-person Search Committee and after equally positive reactions from the college faculty and staff, alumni, trustees. and the Louisburg community. In choosing Dr. May, the Board and the Search Committee found him to be the right new leader for Louisburg College after considering the qualifications of seventy-eight candidates for the presidency.


Dr. May received his A.S. degree in Social Sciences from Vincennes University (Vincennes, Indiana), a B.A. in History from Tusculum College (Greeneville, Tennessee), a M.A. in Teaching from East Tennessee Stat University (Johnson City), and his D. Ed. in Higher Education Administration from Indiana University (Bloomington). He comes to Louisburg College from the position of Vice President and Dean of Academic and Student Services of Waycross College, a two-year unit of the University System of Georgia. Prior to that he was Dean of the Faculty at Tusculum College and geld faculty and administrative positions in Indiana University-Purdue University at Indianapolis.

Dr. May, in submitting his name for consideration, wrote that his "belief is that an institution prospers when it functions in an environment of mutual trust and respect. It prospers because all elements of the

institution give input into defining its mission, assist in developing strategies which give life to that mission, and participate in carrying out those strategies. someone must be the catalyst who brings together the disparate constituencies so that the vision for the institution can be defined. Only then can that unified vision be communicated beyond the institution and have a chance of becoming a reality. It is my belief that I have been such a catalyst before. I believe that I could serve a similar capacity at Louisburg College in the role of Presi-

In welcoming Ronald L. May to Louisburg College, Chair of the Board of Trustees Ben E. Jordan, Jr. also praised the Presidential Search Committee for a job well done in conducting the search on behalf of the college.
