Men's Basketball: Rough Start, High Hopes

The 1997-98 Louisburg Hurricanes are off to a slow start, but the team remains optimistic. The defending Region X Tournament Champions were 11-11 as of February 6. They finished 16-17 last year.

The Hurricanes are led this year by team captains Israel Sturdivant and Walter West. Sturdivant, a 6'0" sophomore from Polkton, North Carolina is currently averaging around 16.0 points per game. West, a 6'6" sophomore from Pungoteague, Virginia is averaging around 13.0 points per game.
