The contest between the Gladiators and the Reefers was fast moving, but the Gladiators proved to be the better team as they took the title with a 24-2 win.

The Reefers held onto a 2-0 first-half lead going into the final four minutes of action, but an intercepted pass by Larry Ross ended their edge. Two plays later, a pass by Ross to Bill Coble ended with a touchdown, giving the Gladiators a 6-2 contest.

Another Reefer turnover gave the Gladiators another touchdown, this time on a Ross pass to Bobby Johnson. The Gladiators now led the contest 13-2.

With less than a minute left in the half, the Reefers were intercepted again. Jack Johnson took the pass and ran for the touchdown.

Ralph Bumgardner led the Reefers, while Ross, John Bridges, Bobby and Jack Johnson and Bill Coble led the Gladiators to the 1982 Championship.
