The fra-ternity is not intended to take the place of the regular dramatic club or other producing groups, but as students qualify, they are reward-ed by election to membership in this society. Play production is an ac-tivity highly technical that it re-quires the services of a trained director and all the resources of a large dramatic association organized on the most democratic basis where every member of a student body may have equal opportunity for self expression
