in B-flat Minor.

The Sonata in E-flat Major is a typical example of the classical sonata form and style of which Haydr is considered an early master. The first movement is in the standard sonata-allegro form and, with typical Haydr freshees and charm of style, retterates at various places in the movement is slow and ornamental and lyrical. The third movement is based on the rondo idea of repetition and return to a main theme and is in a fast minuet tempo. The compositions from Brahms' Opus 116 reflect the philosophical nature of his mature piano music. The popular Chopin Scherzo in B-flat retains much of the idea of surprise originally contained in the scherzo had greatly increased in tempo and had lost much of its original style and form
