Student Enrollment Increases This Year

Plan To Celebrate 50th Anniversary

Gardner-Webb College will celebrate its fiftieth year of operations in October, 1957.

The board of trustees has approved a gala fiftieth anniversary celebration for that date. As a part of the plans for the celebration they have approved a campaign to raise \$1,750,000 for new buildings, added endowment, and increased student loan funds.

New dormitories for 100 girls and 50 boys, a physical education building, a science building, a class room and administration building and apartments for eight faculty members, head the list of planned construction. These buildings are already in the drawing board stage. and a drive is being conducted among the alumni for \$100,00 toward erection of the physical education building.

Other planned additions to the physical plant include a lighted stadium with elevated seating for several thousands of spectators, an outdoor swimming pool for college and community, several courts and fields for tennis, volleyball, softball, and archery, and a park-playground area with a wading pool for small children. Also an outdoor theater is to be built on the hill near the college spring.

The physical additions to the college plant are estimated to cost close to \$1,000,000
