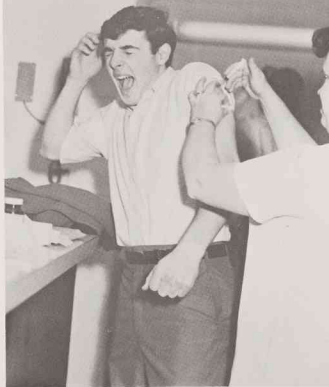
summer work in underdeveloped areas.
