A recent interview with Jack Green, ARA Food Services representative, revealed several new approaches the cafeteria is taking in its service to students.

The physical appearance of the cafeteria will be altered as planters filled with artificial flowers are installed to separate the serving and dining areas. Drapes and larger tables are being added for practical reasons and for beautification.

Each month the cafeteria will feature an evening meal centered around a special theme. These will include a Halloween dinner and costume contest, Thanksgiving feast, and a Christmas dinner. During the week of exams there will be a study break buffet. Each month a huge birthday cake will be served to honor students celebrating their birthdays during the month.

In addition to the festive evening meals, there are several brunches planned which will be accompanied by cartoons and slapstick comedy films.
